

September 11, 1942 - December 27, 2021

John Rodriguez, Jr. was born in San Juan, Puerto Rico, on September 11, 1942, to Juan Rodriguez Lugo and Esther Lopez Rodriguez. He passed away peacefully at home, surrounded by family, on December 27, 2021. On January 3, 2021, he was laid to rest next to his mother Esther in Forest Lawn Cemetery in Houston, TX.

Although a native Puerto Rican, John grew up in Cuba, New Jersey, and New York, each being areas where his father was stationed. He attended James Madison High School in Brooklyn but graduated from Mineral Wells High School after his father transferred. After graduation, John studied cartography at Texas Christian University (TCU) and was a member of the track team. His fascination with maps and navigation led him to join the Marine Corps in 1963 and his passion for flight. John married Suzy, the love of his life, in 1965, but sadly, the couple divorced in 1976. Months after John and Suzy were married, he served in Vietnam as a crew chief for Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron 164 (HMM-164) aboard a CH-46 Sea Knight nicknamed "How Sweet It Is." The highlight of his tour was hearing the news of the birth of his first child. Other highs include a commendation from Boeing for saving the lives of two engineers and being entrusted with the safe transport of Bob Hope and the other celebrities traveling together to perform for troops in the area. He never spoke about the lows he experienced in Vietnam, only about the brotherhood of his squadron and the privilege he felt it was to serve as a United States Marine.

John was a devoted father of three who raised his family in Orange County, California, and Houston, Texas, where he lived until his passing. Interestingly, he never acquired a Texas drawl and retained the New York accent from his childhood regardless of whether he spoke English or the Spanish he modified and renamed "Puerto Rican Spanglish."

Throughout his life, John was guided by his Christian faith. He was a devout member of the Sagemont Church for over thirty years and was honored to serve on Sagemont's Emergency Response Team. In the chaos of war, Marines are taught to overcome any obstacle. "Improve, Adapt, and Overcome" is the Marine motto, a mindset that empowers Marines to cope with physical, mental, or spiritual obstacles. Though he endured physical hardship in the months before he passed, John's faith remained unwavering. In the end, John was able to say, "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith" (2 Timothy 4:7)

It has been said that John was one of the best storytellers you would ever meet, and he would often use both hands to make sure you understood the importance of each crucial event. Thankfully, his three children have inherited this trait. His quick wit and laughter were unforgettable, but in the end, his smile is what melted the hearts of all of those who cared for him during his final days.

John was preceded in death by his parents, both in 2005, and his beloved fiancé, Patti, in 2013. He is survived by his stepmother Luz and his siblings, Maria, Melissa, Eusebio, and Josue; his children, Tammie, Bonnie (Ryan), and Christopher (Jessica); his grandchildren, Kenion, Cade, Ariana, Sean, Jonah, and Leia; the surviving members of HMM-164; and his BellaVita family.

The Rodriguez family is extremely grateful to those whose loving care made John's final weeks so comfortable. Thank you to Dr. Maneesh Patel and his staff and Stephanie and Tina from Heart to Heart Hospice. A very heartfelt thank you to our father's special friend, Kathleen, and her son Andrew for being a part of his life.



HAVE I READ THIS ONE ? ? ?

It happens to all of us "heavy readers". We see a book that looks good at the Bella Vita Library, so we take it home. Then, we start reading it and discover that we have *already read it!*

One way to prevent this happening is to <u>mark the books</u> you have read so that you see the mark when you are selecting a book and know not to take it again.

That could require making a mark in or on the book itself. But, rather than marking the book itself, how about this?

If there is not already a <u>card</u> in the book:

- Take a blank card.
- Fill in the Book Title.
- Make your mark <u>on the card</u>. Your mark can be initials, symbols, whatever you like.
- Put the card inside the FRONT COVER of the book.
- Next borrowers, add your "mark" to that card.

When you return the book, if its card is full, the card will be replaced before it goes back on the shelves.

Why do all of this?

This way, the book remains "clean" if and when it is retired and sold. WHAT? The books are SOLD ? ? ?

You bet. The BV Library maintains only ONE COPY of each book (one hardback and one paperback).

> So, if a duplicate comes along it is sold and the receipts go toward – guess what! – more books!



Your HOA dues includes having your front door maintained every 2 yrs. This means the door will be lightly sanded and a coat of spar varnish will be applied. A new weather strip on the bottom of the door is included, if needed. This will help to protect your door. However, if you postpone or do not request having your door serviced and it requires having your door refinished, the HOA will only cover a portion of the cost to refinish and replace the weather strip. The HOA will pay a maximum of \$180 (the cost to the HOA for regular maintenance plus a 2nd coat of varnish). You will be responsible for the remaining cost of the door service. It is your responsibility to call and have it serviced every 2 years. Please call Jerry Marshburn at 281-998-7709 or come by or contact the Clubhouse at 281-464-3150 before October and get on the schedule. The doors are serviced March through October.
