And while you are there, leave their name and mailing address so that others can send them greetings, too. OR email it to *BellaVitaLibrary@gmail.com*









Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) is a developmental disorder that causes issues with communication, social, verbal, and motor skills.

The most important thing to know about autism is that it is a spectrum disorder, meaning its effects vary from person to person. No two people with autism have the same symptoms. Symptoms generally appear in the early stage of childhood before the age of three. Symptoms can vary from mild to severe.

If you do find yourself noticing some developmental differences in your child or grandchild, early intervention has proven to be one of the most effective strategies to raising a child with autism. The American Autism Association is happy to walk you through getting the proper resources and assistance you may need on this journey.

- Delays in development of spoken language
- Idiosyncratic repetitive language
- Lack of pragmatic aspect of language
- Inability to initiate or maintain language
- Responds to a question by repeating it, rather than answering it.
- Has difficulty communicating needs or Desires
- Lack of appropriateness in verbal communication
- Lack of apparent social and emotion reciprocity

- Prefers not to be held or cuddled
- Has trouble understanding feelings or talking about them
- Restricted, repetitive and stereotyped patterns of behavior
- Difficulty in motor control
- Distressed by a change in routine
- Head banging
- Rocking back and forth
- Lining up toys
- Doesn't share interests or achievements



Your HOA dues includes having your front door maintained every 2 yrs. This means the door will be lightly sanded and a coat of spar varnish will be applied. A new weather strip on the bottom of the door is included, if needed. This will help to protect your door. However, if you postpone or do not request having your door serviced and it requires having your door refinished, the HOA will only cover a portion of the cost to refinish and replace the weather strip. The HOA will pay a maximum of \$180 (the cost to the HOA for regular maintenance plus a 2nd coat of varnish). You will be responsible for the remaining cost of the door service. It is your responsibility to call and have it serviced every 2 years. Please call Jerry Marshburn at 281-998-7709 or come by or contact the Clubhouse at 281-464-3150 before October and get on the schedule. The doors are serviced March through October.

INGREDIENTS

- 1/2 c. lime juice
- 3 tsp. granulated sugar, divided
- 1 bunch fresh mint
- 1/4 c. chopped pineapple
- 1/4 c. quartered strawberries
- $1/4\ c.$ blueberries, plus more for garnish
- Ice

6 oz. white rum, divided 1 (12-oz.) can seltzer Pineapple wedge, for garnish Strawberry, for garnish Lime slices, for garnish

DIRECTIONS

- Among three glasses, divide the lime juice evenly. Add a teaspoon of sugar to each glass and two mint leaves. Add pineapple to one glass, strawberries to another, an blueberries to the third. Using the back of a wooden spoon, muddle fruit and mint.
- Fill each glass two-thirds full with ice cubes. Add 2 ounces rum to each glass and top with seltzer.
- **3** Garnish with fruit, mint, and lime.
