#### FROM THE BOARD

As mentioned last week, we will continue to highlight specific areas of the current Rules and Regulations. These rules and regulations may be changed from time to time as the Board directs. All verbiage contained is not copied verbatim but according to its importance to this article. Highlights, bold print, or italicization are at the discretion of the author. The entire language of the Rules and Regulations are available on the BellaVita website for your review.

#### STATEMENT OF RESPONSIBILITY AND RESPECT:

BellaVita Clubhouse and facilities are owned by all BellaVita homeowners for their use and enjoyment. They are not owned individually, but jointly. Activities and use of the facilities should happen with all residents in mind. While the rights of individuals must be respected, the rights of all homeowners as a group must also be respected. The Board is the final authority on rules and has delegated the administration of the rules to the BellaVita Clubhouse Staff and the Clubhouse Committee. Please respect the Clubhouse staff when they ask for your assistance with respect to any rule. Any concern with respect to one of these rules should be brought to the attention of the Board **via a homeowner concern form** available at the club desk.

#### **GENERAL RULES**

To ensure every residents' enjoyment of all BV facilities, all persons using the facilities shall conduct themselves in a courteous manner with due regard for the rights of others to use and enjoy the facilities. *Violations of rules and regulations could result in suspension of club usage for a period prescribed by the Board of Directors.* 

#### AGE RESTRICTIONS:

Within Club BellaVita, the Billiard's Room, Fitness Room, Computer Room and Annex will be available only to BV Homeowners/Residents and guests 19 years and older. Children under 19 will be permitted to use the pool during designated hours and **must be** accompanied by a BV Homeowner/Resident.

#### **POOL USE:**

**Children's Hours for Pool are posted as Tuesday and Thursday 3 p.m. – 6 p.m.; Saturday and Sunday 1 p.m. – 6 p.m. These hours will remain in effect on holidays listed as:** New Year's Day, Easter, Mother's Day, Father's Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas Eve Day, and Christmas Day. On Memorial Day and Fourth of July, the Clubhouse will only be opened to facilitate the holiday events sponsored by the Veteran's Organization.

<u>THE POOL, SPA, AND DECK:</u> (Full rules are available on the website – the following are considered applicable to current conditions being discussed in the neighborhood)

- All BV Homeowners/Residents or other authorized users must observe pool signage of rules and hours of operations. Pool gates must remain locked and no propping open of the gate. Scheduled pool classes have priority use during reserved times.
- All BV Homeowner/residents or guests who do not follow the rules may be subject to loss of pool area privileges.

No lifeguard on duty. SWIM AT YOUR OWN RISK!

Large flotation devices are not permitted at any time. Flotation noodles are acceptable. Children's safety flotation devices are allowed.

- Proper bathing attire only. No cutoffs. Children in diapers must wear swimming diapers.
- No pets in pool/ deck area; No chairs or lounges may be reserved.





# The Pool Is OPEN!

Summer vacation is here, and families are visiting. Our pool rules are more important than ever. Please cooperate so that all may enjoy our beautiful pool/spa area.

- All BV Homeowners/Residents or other authorized users MUST observe pool signage of rules and hours of operation. Pool gates MUST remain closed and always locked in accordance with City of Pearland ordinance. Scheduled pool classes have priority during reserved times.
- No lifeguard is on duty. SWIM AT YOUR OWN RISK.
- The emergency phone in the pool area is near the drinking fountain. When activated, the phone connects directly to 911 Emergency Operator.
- Visitors and children using the pool and/or pool area must be accompanied by a BV Homeowner/Resident or authorized user. No more than 10 visitors per household are allowed without prior approval from the Clubhouse Manager. At least one adult per 3 children under the age of 12 is required. <u>Children's swim hours are Tuesday & Thursday from 3-6 p.m.;</u> <u>Saturday & Sunday from 1-6 p.m. Children are also permitted on Holidays</u>.
- No glass items are permitted in the pool/spa area. You are required to clean up area when your time at the pool is completed.
- No diving, jumping, running or horse play is permitted. No climbing, sitting, or jumping from the water feature in the pool area is allowed.
- Flotation devices are not permitted at any time, except for baby floats for toddlers. Flotation noodles are acceptable.
- No pets are allowed in the pool/spa or deck area.
- During a thunderstorm or lightning the pool will be closed.
- No tables/chairs or lounges may be reserved. One chair or lounge per person.
- Proper swimming attire is allowed. No cutoffs or frayed attire permitted. Children must be in proper swimsuit or swim diapers.
- If any foreign/contaminated object is found in the pool, please advise staff immediately. The pool will be closed for proper sanitation.
- If the clubhouse is closed or staff is not present, rules still apply.

## ALL BV HOMEOWNERS/RESIDENTS OR GUESTS WHO DO NOT FOLLOW THE RULES OF THE POOL/SPA AREA MAY BE SUBJECT TO LOSS OF POOL ACCESS PRIVILIGES.

Baths consisted of a big tub filled with hot water. The man of the house had the privilege

Of the nice clean water, then all the other sons and men, then the women and finally the children. Last of all the Babies. By then the water was so dirty you could actually lose someone in it. Hence the saying, "Don't throw the baby out with the Bath water!"



Houses had thatched roofs-thick straw-piled high, with no wood underneath. It was the only place For animals to get warm, so all the cats and other small animals (mice, bugs) lived in the roof. When it rained it became slippery and sometimes the animals would slip and fall off the roof. Hence the saying "It's raining cats and dogs."



There was nothing to stop things from falling into the house. This posed a real problem in the bedroom where bugs and other droppings could mess up your nice clean bed.



# **Hurricane Preparedness**



A tropical cyclone is a large low pressure system that derives its energy from warm ocean waters of the tropics. It is characterized by a closed counterclockwise circulation in the Northern Hemisphere and thunderstorms organized near the center of circulation. The hurricane, the strongest classification of a tropical cyclone, typically has an eye at the center with a ring of thunderstorms around it, and spiral bands of thunderstorms extending outward from the center.

In the North Atlantic, the tropical cyclone is defined as a tropical depression, tropical storm or hurricane, depending on the strength of the maximum winds in the storm. Every tropical cyclone brings some combination of the following hazards: damaging winds, storm surge flooding, tornadoes, flooding from heavy rainfall, high surf and rip currents.

#### TROPICAL DEPRESSION:

A tropical cyclone with maximum sustained winds Hurricane force winds are possible/expected of 38 mph or less.

#### TROPICAL STORM:

A tropical cyclone with maximum sustained winds STORM SURCE WATCH: between 39 and 73 mph.

#### HURRICANE

An intense tropical cyclone with sustained winds specified area, generally within 48 hours. of 74 mph or higher.

#### TROPICAL STORM WATCH/WARNING:

Tropical Storm force winds are possible/expected in the watch/warning area generally within 48/36 hours.

#### HURRICANE WATCH/WARNING:

within the watch/warning area within 48/36 hours.

The possibility of life-threatening inundation from rising water moving inland from the shoreline (storm surge flooding) somewhere within the

#### STORM SURCE WARNING:

The danger of life-threatening inundation from rising water moving inland from the shoreline (storm surge flooding) somewhere within the specified area, generally within 36 hours.



Your HOA dues includes having your front door maintained every 2 yrs. This means the door will be lightly sanded and a coat of spar varnish will be applied. A new weather strip on the bottom of the door is included, if needed. This will help to protect your door. However, if you postpone or do not request having your door serviced and it requires having your door refinished, the HOA will only cover a portion of the cost to refinish and replace the weather strip. The HOA will pay a maximum of \$180 (the cost to the HOA for regular maintenance plus a 2nd coat of varnish). You will be responsible for the remaining cost of the door service. It is your responsibility to call and have it serviced every 2 years. Please call Jerry Marshburn at 281-998-7709 or come by or contact the Clubhouse at 281-464-3150 before October and get on the schedule. The doors are serviced March through October.
