In memory of

ROBERT S. PATERNO, (Bob) age 83, died November 6th at his home in BellaVita Subdivision and was welcomed to heaven by his Lord and Savior. He was diagnosed with Sclera Derma in the late 90's but went into remission a year later. Only during this past year did it begin to take it's toll.

Bob was born October 7, 1940 in New York City and was the last of 5 children born to Annette and Charles Paterno. After getting his high school degree, he joined the US Air Force in 1958 and served in Korea as an Administrative Specialist until 1961. Several years later, he attended and then graduated from the University of Massachusetts. While attending the university, Bob became a Fred Astaire dance instructor to help pay for his schooling.

Bob became a successful insurance agent and eventually moved to Houston in 1976. He enjoyed playing golf, skiing ballroom dancing, flying (he obtained a private pilot's license), cruising and scuba diving but his main interest was playing tennis. He and his team won the coveted title of USPTA Adult Tennis League Texas State Championship in 2001 and 2002

In 1987, Bob met the love of his life Kelley who also became his wife and his grand ballroom partner. Together, they cruised the world (over 17 cruises) and visited many foreign ports such as Australia and many countries in Europe. Several were with their best friends George and Beverly Yeiter or with his brother Thom and his wife Fran.

During his tenure in the Houston area, Bob owned and operated four very successful postal centers which he eventually sold at a very profitable margin. In 2004, Kelley and he moved to BellaVita, a community for seniors and fell in love with all the folks here. They took part in many of the activities and even taught ballroom dancing at the club house. Bob was no sloucher: he always had to keep busy. Before long, he was doing various job around BellaVita including installing cabinets, flooring, fans and making minor repairs. He and his brother Thom are responsible for the construction of the library shelving complex.

Bob was blessed with 5 children, all boys: Robert, Michael, Thomas, William and lastly Anthony. All survived him except William who died as an infant. He is also survived by his brother Thomas, his sister Anne, his sister-in-law Frances, a multitude of grandchildren, nephews and cousins and especially his most coveted friends, George and Beverly Yeiter.

For the past 20 years Bob has been an active member of South Main Baptist Church in Pasadena.

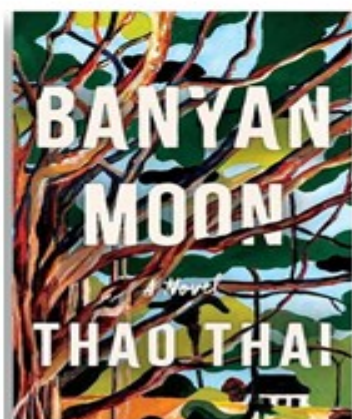

AED



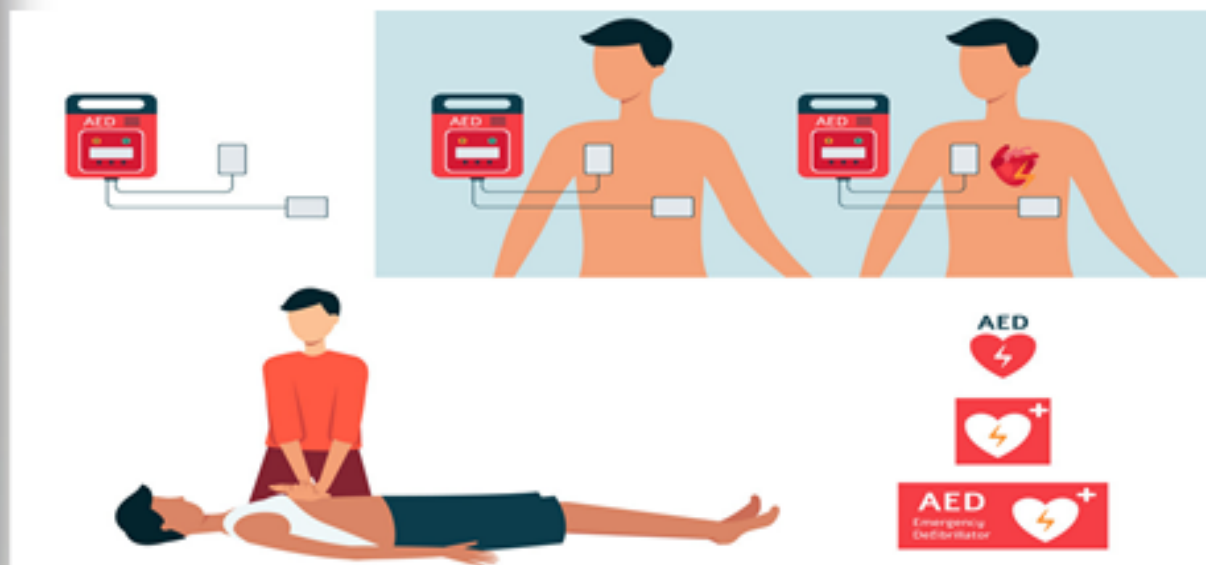
What is AED?

An AED, or automated external defibrillator, is used to help those experiencing sudden cardiac arrest. It's a sophisticated, yet **easy-to-use**, medical device that can analyze the heart's rhythm and, if necessary, deliver an electrical shock, or defibrillation, to help the heart re-establish an effective rhythm.

Why Learn to Use an AED

Sudden cardiac arrest is one of the leading causes of death in the United States. The only way to restore a regular heart rhythm during cardiac arrest is by using an AED. Although you should always request the assistance of trained medical professionals, the average response time for first responders is 8-12 minutes after 911 is called. For each minute that defibrillation is delayed, the chances of survival decrease by about 10%. Therefore, it is crucial to have access to an AED and know how to use it.

At BellaVita, we have 3 AEDs located in the ballroom, library/Annex, and fitness center. Knowing the location of these devices is crucial in case you need to help save a life!

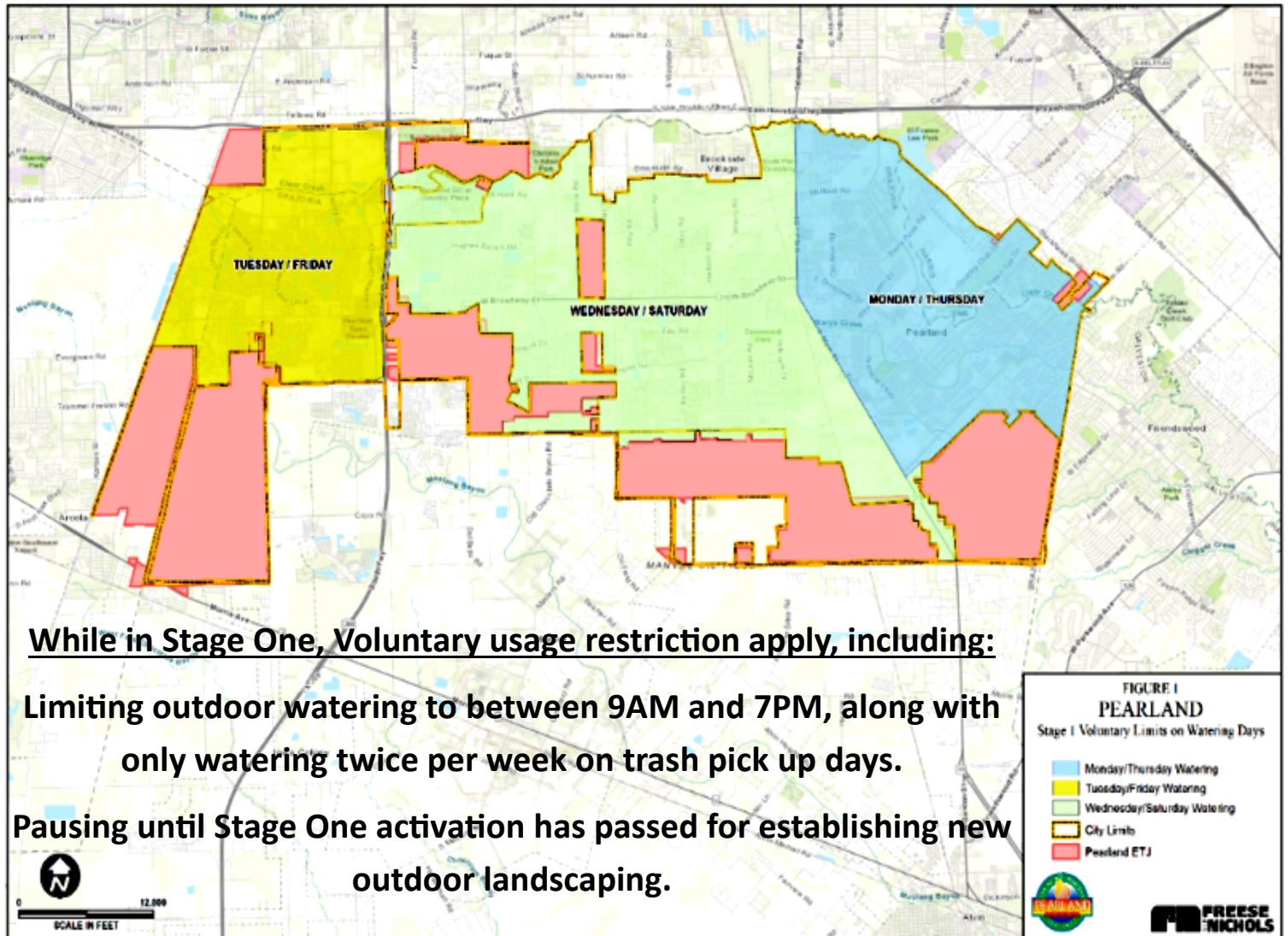




CITY OF PEARLAND REVERTING TO STAGE ONE OF DROUGHT PLAN

DROUGHT CONTINGENCY PLAN

Stage 1 separates Pearland and its unincorporated ETJ into three sections that align closely with trash collection to provide recommendations for watering schedules:



Stage 1 drought restrictions are voluntary (but no less important to adhere to) restrictions which include the following:

- Residential and non-residential water customers are requested to voluntarily limit outdoor watering between 9:00 AM and 7:00 PM and instead implement watering overnight. Moreover, voluntarily limit irrigating to twice per week on the days that align with Pearland customers' trash service days.
- Excessive pooling and/or run-off from foundation watering is discouraged and is requested to not be allowed to run off property and form a stream of water in a street for 50 feet or greater, or pool in a street or parking lot to a depth greater than one-quarter of an inch.
- Water customers are requested to practice water conservation and to minimize or discontinue non-essential water use.



TITANIC TRIVIA

Why did the Titanic have 4 smokestacks if only 3 of them were real? The fourth funnel was added for two very pragmatic reasons, even though it wasn't connected to or needed for venting exhaust from the boiler furnaces. The first was that White Star Lines needed the Olympic class ships to project an air of size and power and the symbol of this at the time was the four-stack liners. It was said that people would refuse to get on even a three-stack liner, preferring instead to wait until a berth on a four-stacker was available. So there was that aspect. The second is more tangible, as well as practical, to ship operations. It provided ventilation for the ship's machine spaces in the lower decks as well as vent smoke via flues from the galleys and the First Class Smoking Room.

The *Titanic* was carrying 6,598 tons of coal to [New York](#).

Of the over 1,500 people who died when *Titanic* sank, only 337 bodies were recovered

When *Titanic* was built in 1912, it was the biggest ship in the world and the largest man-made moving object on earth. It sailed for just four days before sinking.

The *Titanic* burned around 600 tons of coal a day and ejected nearly 100 tons of ash into the sea every 24 hours.^[2]

The *Titanic* had 20,000 bottles of beer on board, 1,500 bottles of wine, and 8,000 cigars. They were just for the first-class passengers.

The richest man aboard *Titanic* was John Jacob Astor IV, who was widely believed to have been the richest man alive at the time of his death. He was worth about \$150 million or about \$3.5 billion in today's dollars.

The most expensive item of cargo that went down with the *Titanic* was a painting called *La Circassienne au Bain* by Merry-Joseph Blondel.

The temperature of the ocean water when the *Titanic* sank was only 28 degrees

Titanic survivor and socialite Margaret Brown demanded that her group of survivors row back to where the ship went down and look for survivors. Her life was made into a Broadway musical titled "The Unsinkable Molly Brown."

Titanic's hull was divided into 16 compartments, and because four of them could be flooded without critical loss of buoyancy, the ship was thought to be unsinkable. But the compartments were not sealed at the top, so water could flow to other compartments.

Ann Elizabeth Isham reportedly jumped out of a lifeboat once she realized that she couldn't take her Great Dane with her. She later died.

The 1997 blockbuster movie *Titanic* cost more to make than the actual ship. The *Titanic* cost about \$7.5 million in 1912, which is about \$190 million now. The movie cost \$200 million, which in 2018 would be about \$360 million.

Only 4 women from first class died during the sinking, compared to 89 third-class women.

Your HOA dues include having your front door maintained every 2 yrs. as needed. This means the door will be lightly sanded and a coat of spar varnish will be applied. A new weather strip on the bottom of the door is included, if needed. This will help to protect your door. However, if you postpone or do not request having your door serviced and it requires having your door refinished, the HOA will only cover a portion of the cost to refinish and replace the weather strip. The HOA will pay a maximum of \$210.00 (the cost to the HOA for regular maintenance plus a 2nd coat of varnish). You will be responsible for the remaining cost of the door service. Please note if there is a homeowner cost, it will be more than previous years as well. It is your responsibility to call and have it serviced every 2 years.

Please come by the Clubhouse or call at 281-464-3150 to be put on the list for 2024. The doors are serviced March through September.

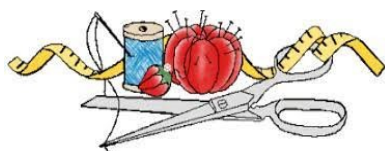
